We have a strong relationship with the military emergency medicine residency program at Brooke Army Medical Center. Of the past several graduating classes, almost half have gone onto a fellowship program. A growing network of alumni throughout the country with a strong reputation, leading to multiple employment offers for PGY3 residents, even in competitive markets. Multiple faculty have been invited speakers to national and international conferences including ACEP, SAEM, AAEM, and abroad, including all of residency leadership.

#### **Rotations include:**

- PGY-1: Anesthesia at South Texas Veterans Health Care System
- PGY-2: Main Methodist Hospital (community), Baptist network hospitals (community), Children's Hospital of San Antonio (PEM)
- PGY-3: Metropolitan Methodist Hospital (community), elective month (choose your own adventure)

#### **Electives:**

- Wilderness elective in US and Nepal
- Global health electives in Peru, Zambia, Nepal, Vietnam.

#### **Pediatrics experience:**

- University Hospital (UH) has peds ED where residents regularly work.
- PGY-1: 2 PEM/trauma blocks. 1 week of peds anesthesia with Tejas anesthesia.
- PGY-2: 1 month at Children's Hospital of San Antonio.
   Longitudinal shifts at UH built into EM months. 1 month PICU at University Hospital.
- PGY-3: longitudinal shifts built into EM month schedule.

#### **Ultrasound experience:**

- Dedicated rotation within 1st half of PGY-1 for max exposure and skill development, dedicated US track, large US division with 7 fellowship-trained faculty.
- ED accredited through ACEP's Clinical Ultrasound Accreditation Program.
- Multiple faculty completed the inaugural Focus of Designated Practice in Advanced Emergency Ultrasound through American Board of Emergency Medicine.
