- PGY-2: Baptist network hospitals (community)
- PGY-3: Metropolitan Methodist Hospital (community), elective month (choose your own adventure)

Electives:

- Wilderness elective in US and Nepal
- Global health electives: Peru, Zambia, Nepal, Vietnam.

Pediatrics experience:

- University Hospital (UH) has peds ED where residents regularly work.
- PGY-1: 2 PEM/trauma blocks. 1 week of peds anesthesia with Tejas anesthesia.
- PGY-2: Longitudinal shifts at UH built into Em months. 1 month PICU at University Hospital.
- PGY-3: longitudinal shifts built into EM month

Ultrasound experience:

- Dedicated rotation within 1st half of PGY-1 for max exposure and skill development, dedicated US track, large US division with 9 fellowship-trained faculty.
- ED accredited through ACEP's Clinical Ultrasound Accreditation Program.
- Multiple faculty completed the inaugural Focus of Designated Practice in Advanced Emergency Ultrasound through American Board of EM
