On behalf of more than 32,000 members and the 130 million patients we see annually, the American College of Emergency Physicians' (ACEP) appreciates the opportunity to comment on the Drug Enforcement Administration's (DEA) proposed rule to move Hydrocodone Combination products (HCPs) from Schedule III to Schedule II and the effects this more restrictive policy rule may have on patient care in the emergency department.

### EMS Medical Directors, Did You Know You Have New Texas Medical Board Obligations?

The Texas Medical Board (TMB) recently adopted revisions to the Off-Line Medical Direction rule (Chapter 197.3) effective May 6, 2013. In fact, they have already taken action against a Texas physician for violating the rule. It is clearly in the best interest of all EMS physicians to understand these requirements.

The TMB made these revisions in collaboration with the Department of State Health Services, EMS Division after input and involvement of groups of TCEP members, active EMS medical directors and the Governor's EMS and Trauma Advisory Committee (GETAC).
